The hot weather has inspired this week's jungle theme – exotic animals and lots of colour!

Colour Chameleon



Chameleons change colour according to their surroundings. Capture that lovely colour change by covering a chameleon shape in all sorts of coloured paper – or even beads, button and pom-poms if you have them! There is a chameleon template with these sheets to get you started.

Crazy Jungle Scene

This fabulous funky scene can be made in lots of different ways. You could cut out leaf shapes (templates provided), cover them in paint and use them to print with.



You could also select some leaves of different sizes and



press them into a tray of paint, then print with the actual leaf onto your background. If you prefer to do a collage, draw around the leaf template onto paper of different shades of green, cut them out and stick them onto a background sheet.

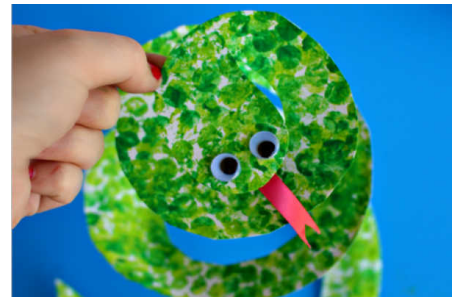


You could even print AND paint to create fabulous texture! Use lots of different colours and overlap the printing or painting randomly as the plants can grow crazily in the jungle – it doesn't need to be neat or ordered. The more random, the better! You could add in animal shapes, too, if you want, or just focus on the lush foliage and exotic flowers.

Curly Tree Snake



The print on this ssspiral sssnake is made by wrapping bubble wrap around a rolling pin and then coating it in paint. Roll it over your paper plate or circle of card. Let it dry, then cut the snake in a spiral outwards to get this fabulous shape.



Alternatively, you could use finger painting in different colours to make the pattern on the snakeskin, and try using different colours that work well together like these blues, purples and greens. Snakes can be any colour you want them to be!
