and create something really unique!

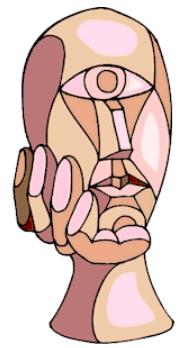
### Toppling Towers



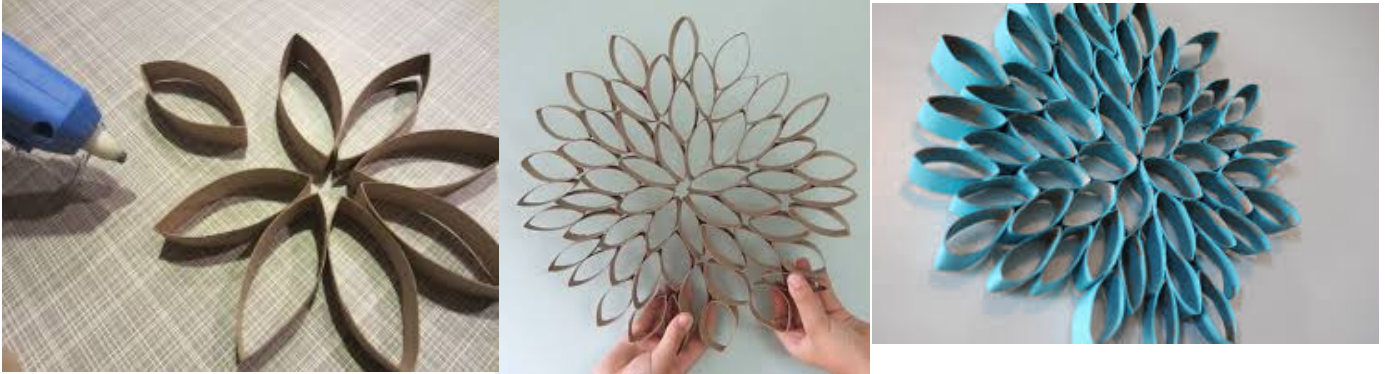
Cut either circles or squares from thick card and make them different sizes, from very tiny to large. Use a larger piece of card as a base, and starting with the largest, layer them up according to size. The squares look good if they are placed this way and that to create texture, and the circles work well if they are slightly toppling over!

You can either leave your towers as they are, or drip thick paint in glorious colours onto them from above. These look fabulous!





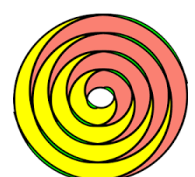
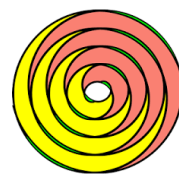
## Pretty Petals



This lovely wall hanging is made from humble toilet rolls! Flatten the rolls and then cut into slices about 2-3cm wide. Then arrange them into a flower pattern as above, sticking them firmly as you go. Work your way out, layer after layer, until you have made a beautiful flower the size that you want. Then paint it either all one colour or work out a pattern of colour that you would like to create. Stunning!

Again, toilet or kitchen paper rolls are used here to make a lovely abstract piece. This time don't flatten the rolls before cutting and make the slices slightly thicker. It's probably easiest to paint them first – inside and out – before assembling them when they are dry onto a base of cardboard. Try placing them in random ways until you achieve a look you are happy with. So unique!
