ENCOUNTER CRAFT – 18th November

This week – SHEEP!

On Sunday we will be looking at a story that Jesus told about Sheep and Goats so we thought we'd give you some craft ideas to create your own artistic sheep using things that you've already got in the house and the templates at the end of this sheet.



PUPPET SHEEP

These cute little sheep puppets are just made from simple card cut outs which are then stuck to a lolly stick or any other kind of stick that you can find. You could also stick some cotton wool onto their bodies to make them even cuter!

DOILY SHEEP

You may not have any doilies in the house but you can create a patterned circle by folding and cutting a piece of paper – there are some instructions on how to do that here <https://www.nationaltrust.org.uk/allan-bank-and-grasmere/features/how-to-make-paper-snowflakes->

Create your sheep by cutting out the head and eyes templates and sticking it onto the doily.

WOOLLY SHEEP RINGS

Cut out a cardboard ring shape from the template at the end of this sheet and then completely wrap it with wool. Then stick on a head and some legs made of cardboard. The wool can be any colour you like or even a mix of colours, it would be nice to see some rainbow sheep!

POMPOM SHEEP

You can go one step further than the woolly sheep above. Once you've wrapped the cardboard ring with wool carefully cut around the edge of the ring with a pair of scissors and fluff the wool out to make a pompom. You can use the head and legs templates to create the finished sheep.





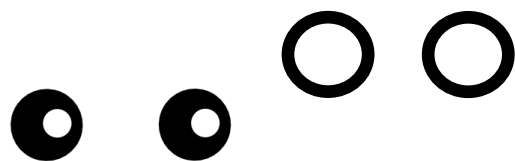
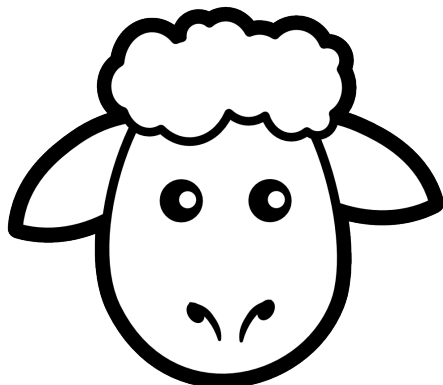
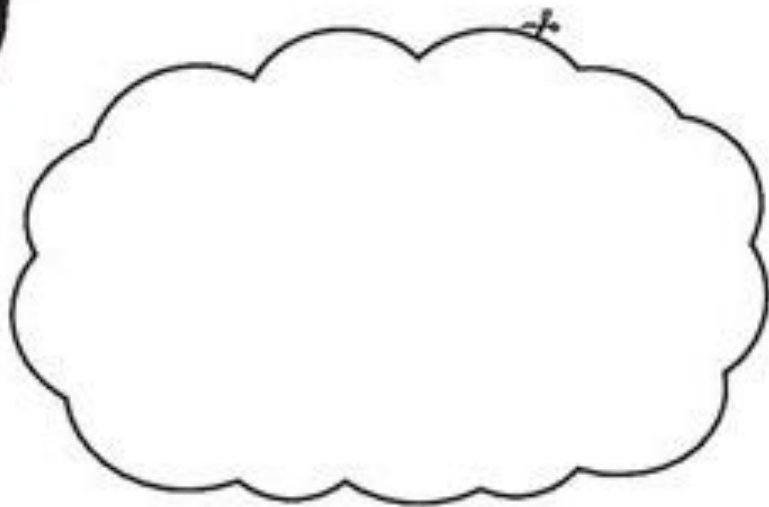
