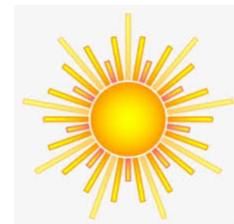




Encounter – 20th May
This week – Fun in the Sun!



The sun is out and its wonderful heat, colours and light are great craft inspirations! Try some of these to celebrate sunny days...



Cut out two small cardboard circles. Then cut fine strips of yellow, pink, red and orange card into different lengths. Old cereal packets are a good source of card. You could leave the design on the front of the packet and use its colours or, alternatively, paint the other side. Then stick the strips around the back of one of the circles and sandwich together with the other one. This makes a unique sun!

This is beautiful! Using a small cardboard circle, (see template attached), make a hole in the centre and use a darning needle and wool to sew out from the centre to create a star effect. Then make small holes all around the edge and thread a piece of ribbon or wool through each one to create the rays. You could stick the whole thing onto a black background so that the rays stay in place. The black will make it really shine out!

This beautiful sun is made of food! The centre is half a melon and the rays are made of yellow, orange and red vegetables such as sliced peppers and baby sweetcorn. Have fun creating an edible sun of your own and then have fun eating it!

This sun is a simple circle filled in with strips of colour. It's so effective. You can make it 3-D by cutting lengths of drinking straws to fit, or laying lengths of wool, and adding pen-drawn lines in between. Fantastic!
