Collage Chameleon

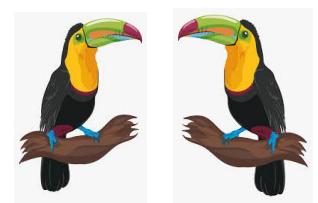
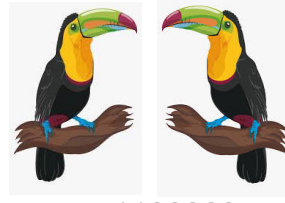
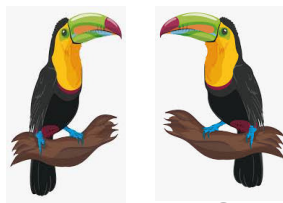
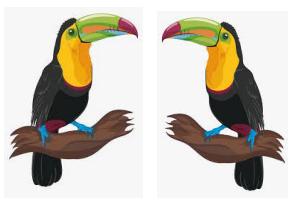


Tear up different coloured tissue paper and arrange in piles by colour. Your little one can stick it along a chameleon shape by colour. There is a chameleon template with these sheets.



This colourful chap is made up of a footprint and four handprints. Add an eye and a big, curved beak from card - (paint the eye rather than use googly eyes for little ones). A simple brown card branch and two green leaves and you have a lovely, jolly scene!

Paper Chain Snake



This snake is made of green card strips looped together like paper chains and then a simple cardboard head is added. It can then be twisted around anything you like to make a slithering tree snake!

This cute frog face is the back of half a paper plate painted with lovely green splodges! The eyes are simple cardboard shapes that can be assembled and stuck on. The best bit – the long, curly tongue – is made either by pulling a strip of paper along the edge of a ruler, or, so your little one can do it themselves, by wrapping it around a pencil.

We've done a pasta lion's mane before – this time we're using a fork! Cover the back of the fork in orange paint and use it to make the thick mane. Let the paint dry and coat the fork in other colours like yellow, brown or rust to build up the texture. Make sure each colour dries before you add the next one if you want to keep the colours separate.
