



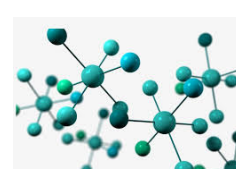
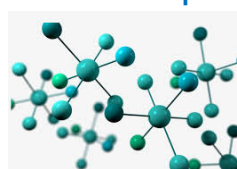
Oasis – 15th October This week – fun with sculpting!

for little ones to express their creativity**

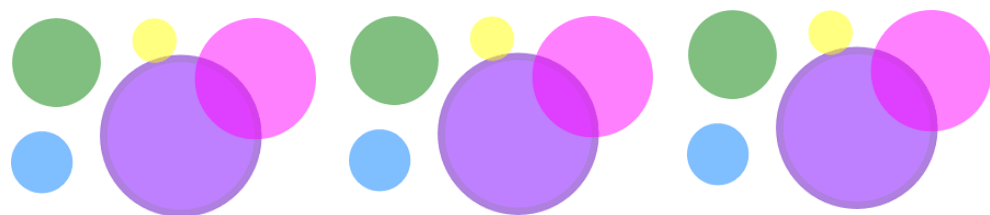
Toilet Roll Towers



This is a fun way to make your own pieces to build with that can be taken apart and reused. Take a collection of toilet rolls and paint them in bright colours. Cut some in half and keep some whole. Then cut a series of slots in either end at different intervals around the edge. You now have the potential to slot them together in many different ways and can play around with them to make a structure that can stand up and balance.



A variation on the activity above, this one involves painting the centre and the edges of paper plates in lovely bright colours and then cutting slots inwards through the rim. They can then also be slotted together to create a funky sculpture!



Circle Sculptures





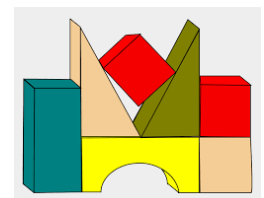
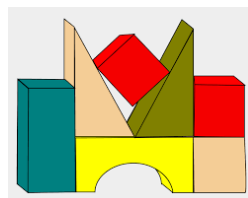
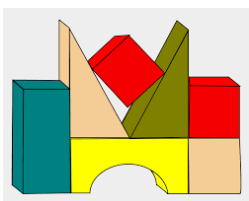
Colour Matching



These fun mini sculptures are good for practising fine motor skills. Paint dried pasta shapes in colours to match your playdough and then your little one can play around with the different shapes, pushing them into the dough to create colourful little works of art! Great for colour recognition, too, or counting activities.

Another way of using these versatile resources is to build with the pasta, using the playdough to cement the pieces together. Use a variety of pasta shapes to experiment and see which pieces hold together the best. Can you build a tower with your child? Great fun!
