Have fun with different forms of process art to create magical winter images!

Peg Painting



This is a simple way to create pretty snowfall. Use different materials attached to pegs, such as poms-poms, cotton wool balls or scrunched up newspaper, and dab onto a coloured background. Using whites and different shades of blue is a great way to capture wintry colours and using the peg gives your child more control.

This is a lovely free piece of work for your child to further explore winter colours. Have a look at ice or images of snow and pick out how many colours you can see other than white! Then use all sorts of materials to collage onto a black background. Here there is kitchen roll, foil, cotton wool balls and dabs of blue paint.











Paper Polar Bear



A great way to use up paper from your shredder! Use the polar bear template attached and cover it in glue. Then have fun sprinkling the paper shreds all over it! You could add a pom-pom eye and nose. Very sweet!


Fill a large baking dish with shaving foam so that the base is covered. Add plenty of drops of blue paint, and, if you have it, perhaps add in a little silver. Your little one can then have fun swirling it around with a stick. Press a piece of card onto the mixture, lift it up and gently remove the excess foam. When it is dry you could add snowflakes punched from paper
